All The Saints of Ireland - November 6^{th}

Pope Benedict XV beatified Oliver Plunkett in 1920 and during his papacy

(1914-22) the Feast of All the Saints of

Ireland was instituted. Oliver was canonised in 1975, thus becoming the first new Irish saint for almost seven hundred years, since Laurence O'Toole; one of the patrons of Narraghmore parish & Crookstown School, and the principal patron of the Dublin Diocese, whose Feast day is November 14th, The Feast day especially recalls the

Feast day especially recalls the seventeen Irish Martyrs of the 16th and 17th centuries who were beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1992 and many others who died as a result of persecution during what in Ireland are known as the "Penal Times".

The early Irish Martyrologies and the Stowe Missal (late 8th or early 9th century Irish missal) give a firm basis to devotion to the saints of Ireland. The feast celebrates the gifts and the glory of God in his saints, their sharing in the paschal mystery of Christ, our communion with them in Christ, their example and their intercession for us, the pilgrim Church, the sustaining power of the Eucharist, the hope of eternal life.

ANSWER: Did you know that of all the Irish saints only four have been formally canonised: St Malachy, St Dlunkett & St Charles of Mount Argus. All of the other Irish Saints that we celebrate on the 6^{th} of November - The Feast of all the Saints of Ireland - are saints by acclamation by the local church. This includes: St Patrick, St Brigid, St Colmcille & St Ita.
