GOD'S GREATEST SADNESS.

THE WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY is dedicated to addressing, what Pope Francis has called, God's greatest sadness, the disunity of Christians. This year it runs from Friday Jan 18th - 25th. WHAT IS CHRISTIAN UNITY? Well again Pope Francis gives us some direction, by telling us what it is not: "unity is [not] equivalent to uniformity." In other words we don't all have to be the same but rather pray for and work towards "a unification around the same center, the Lord." "Unity

in diversity is actually the opposite [of

uniformity]: it involves the joyful recognition and acceptance of the various gifts which the Holy Spirit gives to each one...?

The pope reminds us that if the work of Christian unity is not rooted in prayer, but rather a human effort then it is destined to fail

As Christians we must be focused on the

Kingdom of God and not our own kingdom; another writer puts it like this: "A lack of unity reveals that for some, personal kingdoms have taken precedence and priority over His."

During the week of prayer for Christian unity why not pray this simple prayer in the words of Jesus: "...that they all may be one." Jn.17:21.

ANSWER: Did you know that one of the best definitions of a sacrament is the one given by St Augustine in the fourth century: 'A Sacrament is an outward sign of an invisible reality. What does that mean? Well it means that in just the same way that a wedding ring is an 'outward sign of [the] invisible reality' that a person is married, so too a Sacrament is an outward of the invisible reality that God has accomplished something in the person who celebrates/receives the sacrament. That is the key difference, a sacrament accomplishes something and is not merely a symbol in the same way that wearing a wedding ring is 'just' a symbol. A wedding ring does not make a person married, it merely symbolises it to the world, while а sacrament accomplishes what it signifies.
