Something to Think About...in the second reading this weekend St Paul tells us that we are all parts of the Body of Christ. Where do you see yourself in the Body of Christ? What particular gift do you bring to the body of Christ the Church?

CHILDREN LEARN WHAT THEY LIVE

If children live with criticism, they learn to condemn.

If children live with hostility, they learn to fight.

If children live with fear, they learn to be apprehensive.

If children live with pity, they learn to feel sorry for themselves.

If children live with ridicule, they learn to feel shy.

If children live with jealousy, they learn to feel envy.

If children live with shame, they learn to feel guilty.

If children live with encouragement, they learn confidence.

If children live with tolerance, they learn patience.

If children live with praise, they learn appreciation.

If children live with acceptance, they learn to love.

If children live with approval, they learn to like themselves.

If children live with recognition, they learn it is good to have a goal. If children live with sharing, they learn generosity.

If children live with honesty, they learn truthfulness.

If children live with fairness, they learn justice.

If children live with kindness and consideration, they learn respect. If children live with security, they learn to have faith in themselves and in those about them.

If children live with friendliness, they learn the world is a nice place in which to live.

Answer: Did you know that when the minister of Holy Communion says 'The Body of Christ' they are in fact saying three things: 'This is', referring to the host; 'You are' referring to the person receiving Holy Communion and 'Go and Become' referring to our mandate/mission to be the Body of Christ in the world.

Or to put it in the words of St Augustine: "Believe what you see, see what you believe and become what you are: the Body of Christ." When we say "Amen", we are saying "Yes! I believe this is the Body and Blood of Christ and that I will be the Body of Christ to others."
