welcomed to join in the Service!). World Day of Prayer is a global movement of Christian women who have come together from many different churches on the first Friday in March each year to observe a common day of prayer. The first Women's

World Day of Prayer services held in Ireland was in 1934 in three locations today services are held in Ireland in over 200 locations. Irish women are united on the Day with other Christian women in over 170 countries and islands around the globe, praying with and for each other. The service is translated into more than 60 languages and 1,000 dialects. The Day begins at the International Dateline in Tonga in the Pacific, and a great "Mexican wave" of prayer rises and moves across the world and back to Samoa on the other side of the International Dateline. "

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT... at this time when we are celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation in the parish it might be a good time to revisit our own confirmation commitment.

Do I live up to the ideals of my confirmation? Am I using the gifts of the Holy Spirit? Can I recall what the gifts are? Here is a little refresher: Wisdom, Understanding, Right Judgement, Courage, Knowledge, Reverence and Wonder and Awe in God's presence.

A PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT.

Holy Spirit help me to remember I am called to follow Jesus.

Anoint me with your gifts so that I can be a gift to others.

Send me, like Jesus, to those who need your love and care most.

(Bishop Eamonn gave a copy of this prayer to all the young people he confirmed)

ANSWER: Did you know that the Confiteor actually refers to both personal and social sin. The first line says: I confess to almighty and to you my brothers and sisters. We are acknowledging that sin is not just private but also has a public or social dimension. That when we sin, the effects can place outside the community and we need to ask the community for forgiveness and to pray for us. Asking the whole community bfor forgiveness can be difficult that is why we confess our sins to a priest who acts not just in the place of Christ but also as an official representative of the community nad on behalf of the community forgives and absolves us of our sins and of the effects of our sin.
