World Day of Prayer is a global movement of Christian women who have come together from many different churches on the first Friday in March each year to observe a common day of prayer. The first Women's

World Day of Prayer services held in Ireland was in 1934 in three locations today services are held in Ireland in over 200 locations. Irish women are united on the Day with other Christian women in over 170 countries and islands around the globe, praying with and for each other. The service is translated into more than 60 languages and 1,000 dialects. The Day begins at the International Dateline in Tonga in the Pacific, and a great "Mexican wave" of prayer rises and moves across the world and back to Samoa on the other side of the International Dateline. SOMETHING TO THINK **ABOUT** Some people think that being a Christian is easy, but the Gospel today paints a very different picture. Take a moment and think about all the people that you know. Begin with your immediate family, now consider your extended family, now your friends & neighbours, now your work colleagues, now acquaintances and people you know only casually or socially, now perhaps people you know through others (friends of friends). Perhaps you are up to hundreds or even thousands of people. Of all those people is there one person who really annoys you? Who may even be cruel to you? Perhaps you just don't like them? The challenge of today's gospel is to love that person. To not only wish them well, or at least not to wish them any harm but to actively love them, which means seeking the best for them. Are you up to the challenge of Jesus?

Answer: Did you know that the Gospel of St Luke and the Acts of the Apostles were written by the same person? The Gospel is often referred to as the 'Gospel to the Gentiles' that is the non-Jews. This is because it is believed that Luke was himself an non-jew, most likely Greek. He is taught to have a companion of Paul and in Acts when talking of Paul's mission he often uses the term 'we'.
