CONGRATULATIONS to the girls & boys from St Ita's NS who were confirmed in St Ita's church last Wednesday by Bishop Eamonn Walsh. Bishop Eamonn gave us all a new word on Wednesday when he told the newly confirmed that they are now called *Confirmati*. Even Fr Liam admitted to not having heard that word before.

Bishop Eamonn told the boys and girls

that when they were baptised they had put on the Christian Team Jersey but now that they are confirmed they have been called to play for the first time on the first team. He encouraged the 'Confirmati' to use their gifts and not to be afraid. Referring to the Gospel 'I have come to give sight to the blind' he said that they are none so blind as those who will not see. He asked the boys and girls not to look away from issues like homelessness but to use their gifts to make whatever difference they could; 'use the [confirmation] anointing to choose to act'.

Bishop Eamonn also pointed out that we can be blind to our own 'blind spots' like throwing away a plastic bottle without thinking about it or considering the harm it can do. He went on to say, quoting Pope Francis, 'that there will soon be more plastic bottles than fish in the sea. 'He also encouraged them to use the gifts of Wisdom and Right Judgement to think through the consequences of their actions, particularly around the area of drugs and alcohol. Finally at the sign of Peace Bishop Eamonn gave the 'Confirmati' their first job: if there is someone who are fighting with in school make it up with them before you finish school and move on to secondary.
