THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

It is alarming to think that "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." To find out where my treasure is I need to look not at what I think but at what I do. Answer: Did you know that Transubstantiation is the term used to explain what happens to the Bread and Wine at the consecration of the Mass? The term, Transubstantiation, was first used by the Fourth Lateran Council in

The priest does not

change the bread and wine into the Body & Blood of Jesus, the priest consecrates the bread & wine and it is the action of Christ Himself who causes the real and substantial change

What does that mean? It means that although the bread & wine, look the same, taste the same, feel the same, smell the same, their substance, that which makes them bread and wine, has changed. Their outward appearance is the same but their inward substance. 'their bread-ness and wine-ness' have changed. There are many miracles of the Eucharistic which have borne out this reality. There are many websites where you can learn more about them. As early as the 4th century the Church Fathers, like St Ambrose & St Chrysostom were writing about this real and substantive change.

Belief in the 'real presence' or the 'Eucharistic Presence' is one of the key distinctive features of Roman Catholicism.

If you would like to learn more about Transubstantiation and the real presence then look up the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) Part 2, Section 2, Chapter 1 especially paragraphs 1373-1381.
