THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

"I always wondered why someone didn't do something about it. And then I realised that I am someone."

Answer: Did you know that there is a short prayer that is prayed at the Preparation of the Gifts (The Offertory) that often goes by almost un noticed. The priest says: "Pray sisters and brothers (brethren) that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father. The assembly responds with: "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands to the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good all of His Church." In that prayer is summed up what mass is about and why we participate at mass.

Mass is not meant to be a spectator sport. It is not meant to be entertaining. Mass is participating in the sacrifice of Jesus, it is us offering sacrifice to God, which God takes, and gives back to us as the Body and Blood of Jesus -through the actions of the Holy Spirit. The central aspect of religion (of any religion) is Worship (to the praise and glory of His name) and for most religions, including Judaism, in which Christianity has it's roots, sacrifice, meaning blood sacrifice, is the central aspect of worship.

In Judaism the lamb was sacrificed at the Passover. In Christianity the Lamb of God is sacrificed on the cross. At mass we participate in and share in this sacrifice and reap the rewards of this sacrifice (for our good and the good of the whole Church). To learn more about mass as sacrifice read the Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraphs 1356-1419.
