ST JOHN HENRY NEWMAN - THE NARRAGHMORE CONNECTION.

St John Henry Newman, who was canonised last week by Pope Francis, was invited to Dublin to establish the Catholic University - the forerunner of UCD - by Archbishop Paul Cullen, who founded Holy Cross College, Clonliffe. But did you know that Archbishop Cullen was from Narraghmore?

Cardinal Cullen was born in Narraghmore in 1803, one of 16 children.

He first attended school at the Quaker Shackleton School in Ballitore.

He was ordained a priest in 1829.

He was created a Cardinal on 22nd June 1866.

He was the First Irish Cardinal.

During his lifetime he was a very prominent political figure being compared to Daniel O'Connell and Charles Stewart Parnell.

He attended the First Vatican Council.

He was Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of Ireland.

He was also Archbishop of Dublin. He died on the 24th October 1878 and is buried in Holy Cross College Drumcondra. A statue of him can be seen in Saint Mary's Pro Cathedral in Dublin. His uncle, Fr Michael Cullen was parish priest of Narraghmore.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

There can be no "part-time"
discipleship. Likewise, there can be no
part-time prayer. The deep reason
behind this is that God loves my whole
person and desires all that I am.

Constancy in discipleship demands
constancy in prayer; and constancy in
prayer builds discipleship. In other
words, there can be no separation of life
and prayer—the goal is the same, the
integration of my whole self into the
Christian project. However, the
relationship is primary. It is not that
practical action is more important and
prayer helps, but that prayer is more
important and how I live is the test of
my prayer.

ANSWER: False - Did you know that
when we sin we not only offend and
put distance between ourselves and
God we also, especially in the case of
serious sin, put distance between
ourselves and the Church. In
confession - The Sacrament of
Reconciliation - not only do we
receive God's forgiveness and are
reconciled with God but we are also
reconciled with the Church
