Fast from hurting words and say kind words Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude. Fast from anger and be filled with patience. Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope. Fast from worries and have trust in God. Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity. Fast from pressures and be prayerful. Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy. Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others. Fast from grudges and be reconciled. Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.

40 DAYS

The period of forty days has deep significance and symbolism in the Bible. First of all, God covered the earth in water for Forty days, thus returning the earth to it's original state, in other words, God created a clean slate from which humanity could start again. A time of purification and rebuilding. The Israelites, following the exodus from Egypt wandered in the desert for forty years, again a time of cleansing and preparation for the 'Promised Land' to which God was leading them. And Jesus spent forty days in the desert, echoing the duration of the flood and the exodus. But what is also significant is that Jesus did this right after HIS baptism and just before HE began HIS public ministry. Jesus spent 40 days following HIS resurrection, encouraging and teaching HIS disciples. So our 40 days is a chance to have a clean slate, to start again, if like Noah,

we do what God asks us to do.
