POPE'S INTENTIONS FOR JULY

Pope Francis urges everyone to pray during July for **Social Friendship**

We pray that, in social, economic and political situations of conflict, we may be courageous and passionate architects of dialogue and friendship.

Our Holy Father is often referres to as Pontifex Maximus, or the great bridge builder but we are called to build bridges to peace and social friendship where we can in our circumstances of life.

"Keep your soul at peace, in order to be attentive and very faithful to the inner movement of the Holy Spirit ." St Peter Julian Eymard

Peter was born in La Mure, France, on February 4th 1811, he grew up in a poor family during the anti–clerical, anti-Catholic aftermath of the French Revolution. One day, young Peter Julian, just five years of age, wandered off from the family home. His sister and adoptive sister searched frantically for the boy and finally located him in the parish church, standing on a stool close to the tabernacle of the high altar. In response to their anxious questioning, he answered simply, "*I am here listening to Jesus*."

He was ordained on 20th July 1834 for the diocese of Grenoble, France. He was a close friend of Saint John Mary Vianney - the Cure d'Ars. He had a great devotion to our Lady and travelled to the assorted Marian shrines and apparition sites in France. In 1845 he joined the Marists and went to become the provincial in Lyons. He organised lay societies under the direction of the Marists, preached and taught, and worked for Eucharistic devotion.

He felt a call to found a new religious society, and founded the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament in 1856 - better known as the Blessed Sacrament Fathers, who have a chapel on Bachelors Walk in Dublin - and the lay Servants of the Blessed Sacrament in 1858. His work encountered a series of setbacks, including having to close his nascent houses and move twice, as the houses were not able to support themselves financially. However, his vision of priests, deacons, sisters, and lay people dedicated to the spiritual values celebrated in the Mass and prayer before the Blessed Sacrament anticipated many of the renewals brought about by Vatican Councils I and II. He said: *"The Eucharist is the life of the people"*. Which prefigures that famous line from Vatican II *"The Eucharist is the source and summit of all Church activity"*.

Late in life, during a lengthy retreat in Rome, he became more mystical as he came in closer communion with the love of Christ. He died in his home town of La Mure on 1st August 1868. On December 9th 1962, Pope John XXIII canonized Peter Julian as the Apostle of the Eucharist. We pray that, in the spirit of St Peter Julian Eymard, we will have a great love and devotion to the Eucharist.

It is hoped that we might gather as families and discuss how the church should look into the future and then either as a family or indeed as an individual, we would log onto the Dublin Diocesan website and complete a short response form. There are 7 questions, 3 of which are only a tick response, so it shouldn't take too long to complete.

This is a very rare opportunity to have your say on the future of the Church in our diocese.

The response form is totally anonymous and confidential, the responses go to the Archdiocese only and are not seen by anybody here in the parish.
