"NOTHING IS FAR FROM GOD." St Monica of Hippo

St Monica, is the mother of St. Augustine. She was born in 331 in present-day Algeria. When she was very young, she was married off to the Roman pagan Patricius, who shared his mother's violent temper. Patricius' mother lived with the couple and the duo's temper flares proved to be a constant challenge to young Monica.

While Monica's prayers and Christian deeds bothered Patricius, he is said to have respected her beliefs. They had three children: Augustine, Navigius, and Perpetua. Unfortunately, Monica was unable to baptise her children and when Augustine fell ill, Monica pleaded with Patricius to allow their son to be baptised. Patricius allowed it, but when Augustine was healthy again, he withdrew his permission. For years Monica prayed for her husband and mother-in-law, until finally, one year before Patricius' death they converted.

Perpetua and Navigius entered the religious life, but unfortunately Augustine became lazy and uncouth. This greatly worried Monica, so when Patricius died, she sent the 17-year-old Augustine to Carthage for schooling. While in Carthage, Augustine became a Manichean, which was a major religion that saw the world as light and darkness. Augustine returned home, he shared his views with Monica, who drove him from her table. Some time passed, Monica had a vision that convinced her to reconcile with her wayward son. Monica went to a bishop, who told her, "the child of those tears shall never perish." Inspired, Monica followed Augustine to Rome, where she learned he had left for Milan. In Milan, she met St. Ambrose, who helped her convert Augustine to Christianity following his seventeen-year resistance.

Augustine later wrote a book called Confessions, in which he wrote: *"In place of a basket filled with fruits of the earth, she had learned to bring to the oratories of the martyrs a heart full of purer petitions, and to give all that she could to the poor - so that the communion of the Lord's body might be rightly celebrated in those places where, after the example of his passion, the martyrs had been sacrificed and crowned."*

Six months later, Augustine was baptised in the church of St. John the Baptist at Milan. A short time later in the Roman city of Civitavecchia, Monica passed away. Augustine recorded the words she imparted to him when she realized death was near. *"Son, nothing in this world now affords me delight. I do not know what there is now left for me to do or why I am still here, all my hopes in this world being now fulfilled."*

She was buried at Ostia. In 1430, Pope Martin V ordered her relics to be brought to Rome and many miracles were reported to have occurred along the way. Her relics were placed in a chapel to the left of the high altar in the basilica dedicated to her son, St Augustine. Her Feast day: August 27th and she is Patron of Wives and Victims of Domestic Violence/ Abuse

ST. MONICA PRAYER: I need your prayers. You know exactly how I'm feeling because you once felt it yourself. I'm hurting, hopeless, and in despair. I desperately want my child to return to Christ in his Church but I can't do it alone. I need God's help. Please join me in begging the Lord's powerful grace to flow into my child's life. Ask the Lord Jesus to soften his heart, prepare a path for his conversion, and activate the Holy Spirit in his life. Amen.

Fun Fact: The city of Santa Monica, California is named after Monica, as were the "weeping" springs outside the city and Santa Monica Boulevard.
