ON SUNDAY THE OCTOBER 17th Archbishop



Dermot Farrell Launched the Diocesan Synodal Pathway. It is the hope of our Holy Father, Pope Francis and our Archbishop, Dermot Farrell, that the parishes and

parishioners of the diocese and all God's people throughout the world will journey together and be guided by the Holy Spirit to be a part of and make their contribution to making our Church one which bears fruit for years to come.

Every session of the Second Vatican Council began with the prayer Adsumus, the first word of the Latin original meaning, "We Stand Before You", which has been historically used at Councils, Synods and other Church gatherings for hundreds of years, being attributed to St Isidore of Seville (c. 560 - 4 April 636). As we embrace this Synodal Process, this prayer invites the Holy Spirit to be at work in us so that we may be a community and a people of grace. For the Synodal journey from 2021 to 2023, we propose the following simplified version, so that any group or liturgical assembly can pray it more easily.

WE STAND BEFORE YOU, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts:

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity

so that we may journey together to eternal life

and not stray from the way of truth and what is right.

All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time,

in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever.

Amen.

$\label{eq:catechetical Corner - Continuing our understanding of the Mass.$

WHEN DOES MASS BEGIN? Is it when the choir begin the gathering or entrance hymn as it is sometimes called? Is it when the priest makes the sign of the cross or when he speaks the Liturgical greeting (*The grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ etc...*). There is a point of view that says that mass begins when the community gathers. Why? Because when we gather we become what we are, the Body of Christ, and as we have seen already over the past couple of weeks mass is the Marriage Feast of the Lamb. The Groom at this marriage is Christ and the Bride is the Church - us, we the People of GOD are the Bride of Christ: "*The Church is His beloved Bride who calls to her Lord, and through Him offers worship to the Eternal Father.*" SC 7(From the document of Vatican II on Sacred Liturgy). *HE did this (instituted the Eucharist)...to entrust to His beloved spouse, the Church, a memorial of His death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity a paschal banquet in which Christ is eaten, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us. SC 47*

We are HIS body. As St Paul says: Because we share one loaf and one cup so we are one body (see 1 Cor. 10:16-17) or again "Christ's Body is yourselves..." (1 Cor. 12:27). SO mass is the gathering of the people of GOD into what we have been called to be and chosen to be by choosing to be part of the Church, namely the BODY of CHRIST. So when we come to Holy Communion and the Priest or Minister says: 'The Body of Christ' they are in effect saying three things: This is... 'the Body of Christ'; You are... 'the Body of Christ' Go and be... 'the Body of Christ'. Or as St Augustine put it: "Become what you see, and receive what you are."
