NOVEMBER ALTAR LIST OF THE DEAD



St Columban, also called Columbanus, is recognised as one of the great pioneers in western European civilization.

Columban was born in Leinster in 543. He became a monk at Bangor, Co. Down and later principal teacher there. Desiring to 'go on pilgrimage for Christ', he left Ireland to proclaim Jesus Christ and His Gospel to Western Europe, where people had fallen into barbarism.

Amid hardship and persecution, Columban and his followers founded monasteries throughout France, Germany, Austria, Switzerland and Italy, according to the Irish monastic rule.

His mission was noted for his remarkable zeal, having once been described as "traveling through Europe like a flaming torch enkindling the fire of God's love in the hearts of men. Columban's great contribution to the Catholic Church was the new spirit in European monasticism he had instilled, a spirit of total commitment to Christ and to the values of the Gospels.

His denunciations of the immoral practices of the royal court and the general populace led to his exile from France and Switzerland.

He founded his last monastery at Bobbio, near Genoa, in Italy where he died on 23rd November 615. In the words of Pope Pius XI, "Columban is to be reckoned among those exceptional people whom Divine Providence is wont to raise up in the most difficult periods of human history to restore causes almost lost." He is the patron saint of motorcyclists. Saint Columban pray for us.

CATECHETICAL CORNER - OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Pope Pius XI created this feast in 1925. The Blackshirts under Mussolini were already in power in Italy. Hitler had just become leader of the Nazi party in Germany. The world lay in the Great Depression and atheism was on the increase. What Pius XI was doing in creating this feast was to say to the world that despite dictatorships and economic collapse and false values, Jesus Christ was still King of the Universe.

In 1969 Pope Paul VI gave the feast its current date on the last Sunday in the liturgical year.

He also established it as a solemnity (which is the highest liturgical rank) and gave it a new title – The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

This is a tremendous feast with which to end the liturgical year because it turns upside down all the pre-conceived ideas we have about hierarchy, kingship and what it means to be in authority.

As we hear in today's Gospel (Jn. 18:33-37), Jesus' accusers fail to understand this type of kingdom: "... *Mine is not a kingdom of this world...Yes, I am a king.*" The earthly idea of kingship is of an all-powerful ruler, controller and dictator. Jesus

The earthly idea of kingship is of an all-powerful ruler, controller and dictator. Jesus has not come to 'lord' it over people. He is not interested in an earthly type of kingdom. His kingdom is very different – it is not of this world.

It is not simply that Jesus had spoken about a different place. His words and deeds presented a different way of living, one that is not about control or power but love and service. Jesus' power comes from God and it is a power that builds people up rather than diminishes them. He doesn't deny that he is a king but it is not the word he would use. The only thing that matters to him is the truth and that truth is God. The message of this feast is that we have a hope-filled future and that things will get better for our Church if we can only open ourselves to the teaching, life and rule of our Universal King, Jesus the Christ, God's Suffering Servant.
