WISDOM OF THE SAINTS Blessed Margaret Ball was one of 17 Irish Martyrs Beatified Blessed Margaret Ball was one of 17 Irish Martyrs Beatified in 1992 by St Pope John Paul II. She was born in 1515, was a prominent member of 16th-century Irish society, who, despite being the widow of a Lord Mayor of Dublin, was

arrested for her adherence to the Catholic faith and died of deprivation in the dungeons of Dublin Castle in 1584. When she was 16 years old, she married Bartholomew Ball, an alderman of the City of Dublin, whose wealthy family operated the bridge over the River Dodder, which is still known as Ballsbridge. Bartholomew Ball was elected Lord Mayor of Dublin in 1553, making Margaret the Lady Mayoress of the city. During this time of religious persecution, it was well known that Ball provided "safe houses" for any bishops or priests who might be p*ing through Dublin.

Margaret Ball's eldest son, Walter, who wanted to follow in his father's footsteps and advance his political career, embraced the "new religion" and was appointed Commissioner for Ecclesiastical Causes in 1577. Margaret was disappointed with her son's change of faith and tried to change his mind. Immediately after his installation as Lord Mayor of Dublin in 1580, Walter had his mother and her personal chaplain arrested and taken to the dungeons of Dublin Castle. Ball died in 1584 at the age of 69. She was crippled with arthritis and had lived for three years in the cold, wet dungeon of Dublin Castle with no natural light. Ball had remained in the dungeon when she could have returned to a life of comfort at any time by simply "taking the oath." Blessed Margaret Ball - pray for us.

The Season of Advent, which marks the beginning of the Liturgical year, is so often overlooked in the preparation for Christmas. As the Christmas season, at least in modern culture, seems to start earlier and earlier each year, so Advent gets more and more overlooked.

But Advent is a beautiful season. Each of the 4 Sundays has a different theme and today we begin by looking at Hope. The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes Hope as; "...the theological virtue by which we desire the Kingdom of GOD and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promise and not in our own strength," (CCC 1817).

In his Pastoral Letter for Advent, Archbishop Farrell says: "The Church begins it's year with Hope...In Advent, we proclaim and celebrate our hope and our trust that our God is faithful: that the Lord will come again and again to rescue us, to heal us, to console us, to be with all that he has called into life." The Catechism goes on to say: "It [Hope] affords us joy even under trial: Rejoice in your hope, be patient in tribulation." (CCC 1821). Archbishop Farrell reflects this theme in his letter: "So it is for us, the community of faith that is the Church in this Archdiocese. We are living through dark days. We confront immense challenges, not least that the dominant culture is hostile to faith, while there is much in our story that discourages and even repels many people. Yet as Christians we are called to bring Good News to the whole world, to accompany those at all stages of life's journey towards an encounter with Jesus Christ. We are hopeful, despite the immensity of these challenges, some of which have become even more stark as a result of the coronavirus crisis." He concludes his letter by saying: "In the season of Advent, we unite yourselves with our Blessed Mother Mary, whose own preparation models for us the spirit of hope and faith that brings the light of Christ to life."

To Do: Spend a few moments each day trying to foster an 'Attitude of Gratitude'. Be thankful for the blessings that you have and look to the future with Hope in the company of Jesus and Mary confident that our Lord will come again and again to be with HIS people and to save us from our despair.
