CATECHETICAL CORNER - CHRISTMAS IS JUST FOR CHILDREN??

"I hate Christmas!" I'm sure that we have all heard somebody say that, we might even have said it ourselves, or indeed feel it, even if we don't say it aloud. "Christmas was alright when the kids were young, but now..."

This thinking, while very understandable in our modern world, misses the whole point of Christmas, this thinking misses the meaning of the Incarnation.

What is the Incarnation? It is the visible, tangible manifestation of GOD among humans, as a human. Think about for that for a moment; GOD became one of us! Why? So that we could fulfill the potential with which we were created; to join GOD in living in eternity in the presence of GOD?

We are created in love, from love and our creator wants us to spend our life in love with HIM. To enable us to do this, to show us the way and that it is, indeed, possible, HE came among us as one of us. This is the meaning of the Incarnation, this is what it's all about, this is why we sing with joy and give glory to GOD, this is why the air is thronged with angles singing and praising GOD, because GOD has worked HIS greatest wonder in giving us a sure path to living in the presence of GOD for all eternity.

Saying things like I hate Christmas, or that Christmas is just for the children, is also very true. But perhaps what we hate about Christmas is what we have made of Christmas. Do we festoon our homes with lights because we long for the real light? Is it the sometimes crass, empty commercialism of Christmas that we hate and so it is just for the children?

Hating the commercial side of Christmas is perhaps speaking of what St Augustine meant when he said: 'Our hearts are made for you O God, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you.' A restless heart will never rest in commercialism, but it just might find it in the smile of a new born baby, in the promise that that birth holds. In the hope it both offers and fulfills at the same time. A restless heart might just find rest if it learns to love Christmas...
