"For just as water extinguishes a fire, just so does charity blot out our sins." St John of God.

Despite a life full of tragedy, St John of God accepted God's immense love for him and chose to express his gratitude by caring for the sick and mentally ill. His compassion inspired others to join him, and the Brothers Hospitallers was founded. The order now maintains a presence in 53 countries, operating more than 300 hospitals. Kidnapped at eight years old, he worked as a shepherd in Spain until the age of 22, when

Kidnapped at eight years old, he worked as a shepherd in Spain until the age of 22, when the glamour of the soldier's life lured him away. He spent 18 years as a soldier.

He eventually felt remorse for his sinful actions as a soldier, and sought ways to repent. He experienced a major religious conversion in 1537 after hearing John of Avila preach. He began to publicly, beat himself, pulling out his hair and throwing himself in the mud to express sorrow for his sins. Committed to a mental hospital, he welcomed the beatings that were treatment for the mentally ill at that time. John of Avila visited him in hospital and convinced him that God is more pleased by serving others than by self-abuse. He responded by taking in the mentally ill and destitute, literally carrying them to his home by day and begging for alms to feed them at night. Many were moved by John's sincerity, and began donating food and money to support his work. Others joined him to form the Brothers Hospitallers. He died March 8th 1550 and is patron of hospitals, nurses, the mentally ill, the dying, booksellers, printers, & firefighters. **St John of GOD - Pray for us**

DUBLIN DIOCESAN SYNODAL PATHWAY.

Pope Francis has called a Synod (gathering) of Bishops next year in Rome. Normally when a synod takes place, the Bishops meet and discuss and then the Pope issues a document based on those deliberations.

For this synod, Pope Francis has changed the process. For this synod, Pope Francis wants to hear from you, and from every Catholic and indeed every person of goodwill who wishes to express their views on the Church, with a view to shaping how the church will look as we go forward.

So how does this work? Over the course of the month of March, there will be a series of listening events - 2 in each faith community - where ANYONE who wants to, is welcome to come along and share their views,

To help this listening there are questions to reflect on. At the first meeting they are:

- When you think of your experience of Church, what brings joy?
- ♦ When you think of your experience of Church, what brings sorrow?

And at the second meeting they are:

- When you think of your experience of Church, what brings hope?
- ♦ When you think of your experience of Church, what brings fear or anxiety?

The hope is that a huge range of experiences, positive and negative, and a huge range of expectations and concerns, will be expressed by a great range of people. The various views will be categorized and consolidated before being passed through the Dublin diocese and ultimately to Rome. The listening gatherings are as follows:

- MOONE MON MAR 14TH & 21ST
- ATHY TUE MAR 22ND & 29TH
- CROOKSTOWN WED MAR 23RD & 30TH
- Kilmead Mon Mar 28th & Apr 4th

These are Listening events, there will not be an opportunity for discussion or answering questions, but your questions or concerns will feature in the report from the gatherings which will be brought to Rome for the Synod in 2023. CATECHETICAL CORNER - THE ROLE AND MISSION OF THE LAITY THE APOSTOLATE OF THE LAITY

We have seen that the laity, have been gifted by the Holy Spirit with "special gifts" for their participation in the Mission of the Church, but just where do they fit in and what are they supposed to do? The role of the laity is to: "...exercise the apostolate...by their activity directed to the evangelization and sanctification of men and to the penetrating and perfecting of the temporal order through the spirit of the Gospel. In this way, their temporal activity openly bears witness to Christ and promotes the salvation of men. Since the laity, in accordance with their state of life, live in the midst of the world and its concerns, they are called by God to exercise their apostolate in the world like leaven, with the ardor of the spirit of Christ". (AA 2) What that means is that the laity are called to bring Christian values to every aspect of the world so as to 'Christian-ise' the world. To 'penetrate and perfect' the world. In other words, whatever we do, whatever we work at, where ever we socialise; in every aspect of our lives we are to be as 'leaven' in the world. We do not leave our Catholicism at the door of our workplaces. "[The laity have] only a single conscience, a Christian conscience, it is by this that [they] must be guided continually..." (AA 5) So the role of the laity is not to be a mere spectator or to help father, or to put it more cynically: 'to pay or pray', the laity are to be active collaborators in carrying on the mission of the Church and making the Kingdom of GOD a reality in the everyday circumstances of life. But how are they to accomplish such a task? Well "the success of the lay apostolate depends upon the laity's living union with Christ...This life of intimate union with Christ in the Church is nourished by...active participation in the sacred liturgy". (AA 4) "For all their works, prayers, and apostolic undertakings, family and married life, daily work, relaxation of mind and body, if they are accomplished in the Spirit - indeed even the hardships of life if patiently born - all these become spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. In the celebration of the Eucharist these may most fittingly be offered to the Father along with the body of the Lord..." (CCC 901). It is in this way that the laity share in the Priestly nature of Christ and thus are rightly called 'Kingdom Priests', offering acceptable sacrifices to GOD. * AA is the Decree on the Apostolate of Lay People of the Second Vatican Council
