St Patrick has been buried behind a screen of plastic Shamrock and drowned in an ocean of alcohol. But when we strip back of all the celebrations that mark our National saint's feastday, we find a man so in love with God and so driven to make God known and loved. Despite the conditions in which Patrick lived, despite the hardships that he was forced to endure, he was able to say: "he [God] looked down on my lowliness and had mercy on my youthful ignorance. DUBLIN DIOCESAN SYNODAL PATHWAY.

Pope Francis has called a Synod (gathering) of Bishops next year in Rome. Normally when a synod takes place, the Bishops meet and discuss and then the Pope issues a document based on those deliberations.

For this synod, Pope Francis has changed the process. For this synod, Pope Francis wants to hear from you, and from every Catholic and indeed every person of goodwill who wishes to express their views on the Church, with a view to shaping how the church will look as we go forward.

So how does this work? Over the course of the month of March, there will be a series of listening events - 2 in each faith community - where ANYONE who wants to, is welcome to come along and share their views,

To help this listening there are questions to reflect on. At the first meeting they are:

- When you think of your experience of Church, what brings joy?
- ♦ When you think of your experience of Church, what brings sorrow?

And at the second meeting they are:

- ♦ When you think of your experience of Church, what brings hope?
- ♦ When you think of your experience of Church, what brings fear or anxiety?

The hope is that a huge range of experiences, positive and negative, and a huge range of expectations and concerns, will be expressed by a great range of people. The various views will be categorized and consolidated before being passed through the Dublin diocese and ultimately to Rome. The listening gatherings are as follows:

- ATHY TUE MAR 22ND & 29TH
- CROOKSTOWN WED MAR 23RD & 30TH
- Kilmead Mon Mar 28th & Apr 4th

These are Listening events, there will not be an opportunity for discussion or answering questions, but your questions or concerns will feature in the report from the gatherings which will be brought to Rome for the Synod in 2023. CATECHETICAL CORNER - THE ROLE AND MISSION OF THE LAITY PARTICIPATION IN CHRIST'S PROPHETIC OFFICE

What is it to be a prophet? We often misunderstand what it is to be a prophet. A prophet is not one who sees into the future like some sort of fortune teller. A prophet is one who speaks for GOD, a prophet is one who shares the love and the truth of GOD with those around them. In this sense, Jesus Christ was a prophet of the Father. In today's Gospel we see Jesus with Elijah, the foremost of the Old Testament prophets. We, the laity, have a very onerous role and responsibility in the Church, it is to be prophets, to share in the Prophetic role of Christ, making the love of GOD known to all around us. But surely that is the role of the ordained priest? Yes it is, but it is also ours, by virtue of our baptism. According to St Thomas Aquinas "To teach in order to lead others to faith is the task of every preacher AND OF EACH BELIEVER." The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), quoting the document on the Church from Vatican II says: "Christ . . . fulfills this prophetic office, not only by the hierarchy . . . but also by the laity. He accordingly both establishes them as witnesses and provides them with the sense of the faith [sensus fidei] and the grace of the word" (CCC 904) We are called to do this not only by the example of our way of living but also by word, when the opportunity arises or requires it: "This witness of life, however, is not the sole element in the apostolate; the true apostle is on the lookout for occasions of announcing Christ by word, either to unbelievers . . . or to the faithful." (CCC 905 ref: AA 6)

So every Baptised Catholic has the duty and responsibility to bear witness to the love of GOD and to draw others to GOD, not only by example but also by word. This duty comes from our Baptism the newly baptized, who has become a Christian, that is, one "anointed" by the Holy Spirit, incorporated into Christ who is anointed priest, prophet, and king (CCC 1241) In order to accomplish this we need to have knowledge of the Word, we need to know what it is, or rather Who it is that we are proclaiming. St Jerome, who translated the Bible from it's original Hebrew and Greek into Latin, said that: "Ignorance of the Scripture is ignorance of Christ."

In the spirit of St Patrick, let us go and be prophets in our own time and place.
