#### CATECHETICAL CORNER - THERE'S AN AWFUL LOT OF KISSING GOING ON AT MASS!

Have you ever noticed that when the priest comes to the Altar, the Altar means the Altar table, the area in which the Altar is situated is known as the Sanctuary, the first thing that he does at the beginning of Mass is to kiss the Altar. He may sometimes just do what is called a 'profound bow' which is a bow from the waist as opposed to a simple bow from the neck or of the head only. But why does he do this?

Sacrifice requires an Altar. The altar of Sacrifice on which Christ died is the Cross, and when we come to Mass, that same sacrifice, the once and for all sacrifice of Christ on the Cross, is made present again and we are partakers and sharers in that sacrifice. It is not a re-enactment of it, it's not 'let's pretend', it is really, truly and substantially present and we are, in a way, transported back to Calvary, or rather, Calvary is transported to us and we are present to the sacrifice of Christ. So the priest kisses the Altar because it represents Christ and the Cross on which He died. There is also a long tradition in the Church that when an Altar is constructed and consecrated by the Bishop, that there are relics of saints and martyrs enclosed with the altar and so the priest is also reverencing them. Why? Because it is on the very shoulders of our ancestors in faith that we are offering the sacrifice, and indeed it is the same sacrifice that they offered and gave their lives for. We read in the book of Apocalypse Chapter 6: 9. "I saw underneath the altar the souls of those who had been killed for the word of God and for witnessing to it.

The kissing doesn't stop there, oh no, there is more. Again you may have noticed that after the priest proclaims the Gospel he will hold up the book of the Gospels, or the Lectionary, which is the book that contains in three volumes all of the readings that we hear at mass and after he says: "The Gospel of the Lord.", he will then kiss the book. Why? Because as the document from Vatican II on the Liturgy (Sacrosanctum Concillium) says: He [Christ] is present in His word, since it is He Himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church. (SC #7). That is also why we stand for the Gospel, because it is Jesus Himself who is speaking to us.

Did you know that the Church reveres the Scriptures to the same extent that it reveres the Eucharist? "The Church has always venerated the divine scriptures as she venerated the Body of the Lord..." (from the document of Vat. II on Divine Revelation).

In addition to all of that, there is, traditionally, still more kissing. The sign of peace, would traditionally have been a kiss. In 2 Cor.13:12 & Rom. 16:6. we read: "greet each other with a Holy kiss...invoke the peace of one another with a Holy kiss... So you see, there really is an awful lot of kissing going on at mass.
