CATECHETICAL CORNER - "LET'S START AT THE VERY BEGINNING...IT'S A VERY GOOD PLACE TO START!"

When does mass begin? Some that it begins when the people gather. Others will say it begins with the opening hymn, if there is one. Others still will say it begins when the priest comes to the altar, and as we saw last week, kisses it. This last one is probably the most accurate. But joined to this is what follows next. Firstly, the priest leads the people in making the sign of the cross. This is important because it reminds us of the central reality of our faith and the central reality of the Mass, namely the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. The sacrifice which we have come to re-present. The sacrifice through which are given the promise and hope of eternal life.

The next thing that happens is equally significant. The priest says one of three liturgical greetings, these are: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. Or Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Or The Lord be with you. What is significant about the greeting? Firstly, there are all scriptural. The first option is the conclusion of St Paul's second letter to the Corinthians, the second is also often used in the writings of St Paul, see the letter to the Galatians 1:3. The third is from the book of Ruth, in the Old Testament. This third option is probably the most significant. It is not merely a polite greeting as in 'good morning, how are you doing today?' Neither is it a wish, hope or aspiration that GOD will be with. It is rather a statement. It is saying that, by virtue of your baptism, GOD is with you. It is like the usual greeting in Irish, 'Dia dhuit'. Which again, when properly translated, is not a banal hope that GOD will be with but is again a statement of fact, that GOD is already with you.

The General Instruction on the Roman Missal, which is the guidebook/explanation to how the Mass book - Missal, used by the priest works. It says: "Then by means of the Greeting he [the priest] signifies the presence of the Lord to the assembled community. By this greeting and the people's response, the mystery of the Church gathered together is made *manifest.*" (General Instruction on the Roman Missal #50)

This greeting appears several more times throughout the Liturgy: before the proclamation of the Gospel, the Preparation of the Gifts and before the final blessing. Each time it reminds us that we are GOD's children through the adoption of Baptism and that GOD is within us. Thus we are making the Body of Christ, truly visible in the world. The use of it before the final blessing is significant, because it is at this point that we are being sent out, we are not being sent home, in the sense that, "OK, that's all folks see you next week". No, we are being commissioned to go out to love and serve the LORD in and through those we meet. Why? because IS with us! Dia dhuit.
