**CATECHETICAL CORNER - WHAT'S IN THE BOX?**

Most of us have a pretty good idea what the beautifully decorated and ornate gold box that we see behind the altar is and we have some idea what it contains, but have you ever given much thought to why it's there or where it came from? Was it just some good idea that someone came up with a long time ago and we just keep it around because we haven't come up with a better idea yet?

First things first, it's called the Tabernacle. The word means a place of meeting. In the book of Exodus, we read how GOD gave Moses some very clear instructions on how the Tabernacle, or the Ark of the Covenant as it was called, was to be constructed and what it was to contain. In it were placed the two stone tablets on which the Ten Commandments had been inscribed by GOD.

The Tabernacle was placed in the Sanctuary, again constructed following the design of GOD. In a Catholic church, the Sanctuary is the area in which the Altar, Ambo, Priest's chair and usually the Tabernacle are located. The biblical Tabernacle also contained the seat of judgment. In addition, according to the letter to the Hebrews 9:4, it also contained the Rod of Aaron. The rod of Aaron was a walking stick, but it represented authority. The miracle of the rod of Aaron was used by GOD to confer the 'priesthood' on Aaron and his descendants. When the stick was planted in the ground it blossomed, and according to GOD this was HIS way of 'ordaining' Aaron (*See the Book of Numbers Chapter 17*).

There is, according to the letter to the Hebrews, another item in the 'tabernacle' and that was a gold pot containing some of the Manna that fed the Israelites on their journey through the desert. It is from this Manna and the description of it in the book of Exodus that we have the Host that we receive at Holy Mass. This is what the book of Exodus says: "*When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was something fine and granular, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. As soon as the Israelites saw this, they said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That', Moses told them, 'is the food which GOD has given you to eat'*" (Ex. 16:14-15). This is what the Tabernacle in a Catholic church contains: "*...the food which GOD has given you to eat.*"

In Exodus, no one was allowed to enter into the place where the Tabernacle was, the Holy of Holies, except the High Priest and even then only once a year. A veil was placed across the sanctuary and it was kept holy - set aside for GOD. The priests and all the vessels, lamps and furniture were anointed and consecrated to GOD

When we come to the church, when we come into the Holy of Holies, we are coming into the very presence of GOD. We are coming to that place that is consecrated and set apart for GOD and is therefore Holy. That's what's in the box.
