CATECHETICAL CORNER - "IF ONLY..."

At the end of Mass we say: "Thanks be to GOD", and although it might sometimes feel like it, we are not actually saying "it's over...thanks be to GOD" We are in fact saying; 'thanks be to GOD' for all that just happened, for all that we have just witnessed and been a part of and for the very important job we have been given. '*What job is that?*' I hear you say. 'I didn't sign up for anything.' Well actually you did! You were given this job at your Baptism, commissioned in it at your confirmation and you are recommissioned every time you come to Mass.

The word mass is a translation of the Latin and comes from the last words spoken by the priest: "Ita missa est!" A literal translation is: "Go, it is a dismissal (you have been dismissed)." But it has come to mean something like, "Go, you have been given a mission". Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI in his encyclical Sacramentum Caritatis - The Sacrament of Love - said: "In antiquity, missa simply meant 'dismissal'. In Christian usage, however, it gradually took on a deeper meaning. The word 'dismissal' has come to imply a 'mission'. These few words succinctly express the missionary nature of the Church" So, every time we come to mass we are being re-co-missioned. In other words we are being called, or rather sent, to do what we were graced to do at our Baptism and Confirmation. What is that? Well the priest tells us what to do as he concludes Mass: "Mass is ended Go in peace to love and serve the LORD." or "...Go in peace, glorifying the LORD by your life." or "...Go and announce the Gospel of the LORD." or very simply, just: "Go in peace." The common thread is "Go". It is being sent out, it is being missioned to spread the Gospel of the LORD. How? By 'loving and serving the LORD' or by 'glorifying the LORD by your life'. We are to take up this difficult challenge to be a missionary Church, a missionary people in the everyday circumstances of life.

The role of the laity is very clear. In the document on the Laity from the Second Vatican Council - Apostolicam Actuositatem - #2 we read: They [the laity] exercise the apostolate [the mission of the Church] in fact by their activity directed to the evangelization and sanctification of [people] and to the penetrating and perfecting of the temporal order through the spirit of the Gospel. In other words, this mission that we are given is to bring Gospel values into our everyday lives. A politician must bring Gospel values into her decision making, a Garda must bring Gospel values into their dealings with all people, so too a doctor, a nurse, a car mechanic, a parent, a child, a road sweeper. A tradesperson must deal fairly and honestly with all people. An employee must bring Gospel values into their work and dealings with their employer. In this way we live the mission that we are given, in this way the Gospel becomes like leaven in the world. In this way "the Gospel spirit [will] permeate and improve the temporal order" Can you imagine a world like that? Wouldn't it be amazing? If only...!
