CATECHETICAL CORNER - "DADDY"

Mrs Gump, Forrest's' momma, used to say that life is like a box chocolates. I say, mass is like a bar of chocolate, there are many parts, or squares, but they make up a whole. We may look at some of them another time. But the Communion Rite begins with the priest saying: "At the saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say Our Father..." We DARE to say...?

Surely GOD loves us! Surely if GOD is our Father and HE loves us, why wouldn't we 'dare' to say Our Father? What have we got to be afraid of? Well, the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) says: "Between God and us there is an immeasurable inequality, for we have received everything from him, our Creator." (CCC #2007). Everything we have, or are, comes from our creator!

When Moses encountered GOD in the burning bush, GOD told him to take off his shoes as he was standing on holy ground, the ground was holy because GOD was present. (see Exodus 3:5). St Teresa of Avila, whose feast day is October 15th said that: [humility is walking in the truth of who GOD is and who we are before GOD]. Seeing ourselves as GOD sees us, which includes the good, but recognising that any good that may be present is, itself, Gift. Acknowledging our state of comparable nothingness before GOD, should give us cause for pause. It should call us to say, with the psalmist; 'What is man (WHAT AM I) that you care for him (ME), mortal man that you keep him (ME) mind?" (Psalm 8:4). The psalmist goes on in the next verse to say: "Yet you have made him (ME) little less than a GOD, with glory and honour you crowned him (ME)." (Ps.8:5). The psalmist is saying that any dignity we have as people, any glory or honour, is given to us by GOD. The dignity of adopted children through baptism and the incarnation of GOD's only Son among us.

We can only say that GOD is father because it is GOD Himself who lets us make this claim. We read in St Paul's letter to the Galatians: God sent his Son....so that we could receive adoption as [children]. As you are [children], God has sent into our hearts the Spirit of his Son crying, 'Abba, Father'; (Gal. 4: 4-6). The CCC says: "We can invoke GOD as Father because HE is revealed to us by the Son..." (CCC #2780). In Matthew 11:25-27, Jesus tells us that; "no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the son chooses to reveal HIM". When we cry 'Our Father (Abba is the Hebrew word for daddy) it is under the inspiration of GOD's own Spirit, the Holy Spirit. Such a privilege, such a great gift is not something that we should take for granted. In praying the Lord's Prayer, we not only see GOD as HE is but we also see ourselves as we are. Adopted children, beloved by GOD given immense and undeserved 'glory and honour'.
