THE PARISH TEAM:

CATECHETICAL CORNER - "No Guts, No GLORY"

Whether you are a soccer fan or not you cannot help but notice that the World Cup is on at the moment, where some of the greatest players of the game are competing to win. When a goal is scored the celebrations seem to me to be coming more and more extravagant, and lasting longer, as praise and glory are heaped on the scorer. And while the individual may be the one who scores it is the team who receive the praise, the manager may even become very sought after. I have to confess, that sometimes when the teammates are jumping on the scorer I feel a bit sorry for him. I rather him than me... In this we can see what it means to glorify someone, we see how they are applauded, honoured and showered with praise and plaudits. We may even join in, in our own small way. We might wear a jersey with the name of our favourite player on it, we might talk about him and say how fantastic he is, how great the team are; "Did you see that goal, isn't he amazing? What a great team"

And yet when we come to Mass, or sometimes, when we pray we give glory to GOD: "Glory be to the Father...Glory to GOD in the highest..." is this what we mean; "Did you see that...sunrise...child-birth, leaf, blade of grass, breath I took...step I walked...my sins are forgiven...I have the promise of eternal life, isn't HE amazing?" When we pray: "We praise you, we bless you, we glorify you, we adore, we give you thanks..." What is that we are saying? We are 'applauding, honouring, and showering GOD with praise and plaudits.' Why? because Jesus is the one who takes "away the sins of the world". Jesus is the One "seated at the right hand of the Father"

During Advent, which begins this Sunday, we do not sing or pray the Gloria at mass, because we are waiting. We are waiting like the Shepherds. We are waiting with the whole Church so that on Christmas we can joyfully acclaim with those shepherds, with our sisters and brothers in the Church; "Glory to GOD in the highest..." Our Advent time of waiting and preparing finds it's fulfilment in the Christmas Gloria. At Christmas we honour and shower GOD with glory, applause, plaudits and praise. Not because HE has done something so ordinary, no matter how extra-ordinary, as a goal. No, because HE has has become incarnate among us as one of us. He, "the Holy One...the Lord...the Most High..." has become the lowliest, the servant, the least holy, a refugee baby born in a dirty stable.
