- Help your child to write a Family Remembrance Book, where you can write the names of all those family members who have died.
- You could also write the names of people who you might consider as modern day saints. People whose lives you would like your child to copy. These people could be family members, a saint of the Church, some famous person, or even just somebody you know who is a good example of living a Christian life.
- There is a lovely tradition in the Catholic Church during the month of November of visiting a cemetery and praying for those who have died. If visiting a cemetery is not possible then whenever you pass by a cemetery it is also a nice custom to teach your children to make the sign of the cross and to say a short prayer for those who have died. Here's a simple prayer for those who have died: "May they Rest in Peace. Amen"

Getting Started Checklist:

A small table/shelf/space - even a window sill. A cloth - white to start but this can change during the year.


A small bottle or bowl of Holy Water.
