#### CATECHETICAL CORNER - BE MY VALENTINE...FOREVER.

St Valentine is probably one the most famous saints in the Church. He has managed to reach into popular culture despite the fact that we know very little about him. What we do know is that he was martyred for celebrating sacramental marriages. In those times, the time of the Roman Empire, only unmarried men were permitted to serve in the army. Since serving in the army came with a possible death sentence, many men sought to avoid it by getting married. Valentine incurred the ire of the Romans by facilitating these marriages and when he refused to stop, despite having been warned, he was executed.

As the world celebrates Valentine's day, with no reference to the saint, it might be worth taking a brief look at the nature of Sacramental Marriage. To understand the significance of Sacramental Marriage it is necessary to look at the nature of the Holy Trinity, because it is in the nature of the Trinity that we find the Church's understanding of marriage.

The Holy Trinity is a relationship of Love. GOD the Father loved the SON into being who in turn loves the Father. This relationship of constant love flowing between Father and SON is what, or rather Who, we call the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the very fruit of the love that the Father has for the Son and the Son for the Father. Just as children are the fruit of the love that a husband has for his wife and a wife for her husband. In the book of Genesis we read how GOD created us: "...in HIS own image and likeness...male and female HE created them..." (Gen.1::26-27). What is this image in which we are created? Love! We are created in the image and likeness of GOD who empties HIMSELF in love for the other, thus bringing the other into being. This is where the Bible begins, in a relationship of love, love within the nature of GOD and love of GOD for HIS creation, we are literally loved into existence.

Marriage is instituted by GOD; "it is not good that man should be alone..." The Catechism of the Catholic Church puts it like this: "The intimate community of life and love which constitutes the married state has been established by the Creator...God himself is the author of marriage." (CCC 1603) Marriage, in the Catholic understanding, is to enter into the very life of the Holy Trinity, it is to become God like. The mutual giving of self and emptying of self for love of the other is what is at the very heart of the Trinity and a happy, successful marriage.

Sacramental Marriage makes Christ present in the world and in the marriage. In the document of Vatican II on the Church in the Modern World (Gaudium et Spes) we read: "...so now the Saviour of men [Christ] and the Spouse of the Church [Christ] comes into the lives of married Christians through the sacrament of matrimony. He abides with them thereafter so that just as He loved the Church and handed Himself over on her behalf, the spouses may love each other with perpetual fidelity through mutual self-bestowal." (GS 48). When we honour St Valentine, we honour marriage. When we honour marriage we honour GOD - FATHER, SON & HOLY SPIRIT.
