#### CATECHETICAL CORNER - "I AIN'T AFRAID OF NO GHOST"

Do you believe in ghosts? When we think about people coming back from the dead, we usually think of them as ghosts or spirits. Usually with the ability to walk through walls, to appear or disappear at will. That sounds like what happened with Jesus. In our gospel today we see HIM walking along with two of HIS disciples, but they didn't recognize HIM, they could see HIM alright but the didn't recognize HIM. So was Jesus, really just a ghost? What does it mean that He was raised from the dead? Because if Jesus is just a ghost, then really, as St Paul says: "*If Christ has not been raised from the dead…then of all people we are the most pitiable*." (1 Cor. 15 12-16)

So what does it mean that Christ is raised from the dead? The short answer is we don't really know, as St John says: "...what we shall be in the future has not yet been revealed. We are well aware that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he really is." (1 Jn.3:2).

When Jesus was seen by HIS disciples He was seen with a body, He ate with them: "*they offered HIM a piece of grilled fish which HE took and ate before their eyes.*" (Lk. 24:42-43). Thomas put his hands into Jesus' side and touched the wounds on His hands. *(see Jn. 20: 27).* So the biblical evidence is that Jesus had a body after rising from the dead He wasn't a spirit or a ghost, as some like to think. Indeed, the last line of the Creed reads: "*I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.*" But what does that mean?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church answers this for us. In ##997 - 998 it says: "What is "rising"? In death, the separation of the soul from the body, the human body decays and the soul goes to meet God, while awaiting its reunion with its glorified body. God, in his almighty power, will definitively grant incorruptible life to our bodies by reuniting them with our souls, through the power of Jesus' Resurrection....Who will rise? All the dead will rise..."

How? Christ is raised with his own body: "See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself" To be fair the Catechism goes on to say that the 'How' of the resurrection exceeds our imagination and understanding (see CCC #1000). However, it also says that we have a glimpse of what it might be in the Eucharist. It quotes St Irenaeus: "Just as bread that comes from the earth, after God's blessing has been invoked upon it, is no longer ordinary bread, but Eucharist, formed of two things, the one earthly and the other heavenly: so too our bodies, which partake of the Eucharist, are no longer corruptible, but possess the hope of resurrection." In other words the grain dies and, by the action of GOD is transformed as something different. St Paul, in the letter to the Romans, puts it like this: "If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit who dwells in you." (Rom. 8:11). I think we can see that we are really grasping at straws to try and explain this, it is one of the great mysteries of our faith that, as the CCC says: "...it is accessible only to faith." (CCC #1000).

The Resurrection of the Body is central to the faith of Christians, without it we have no faith, we have no joy, we are not forgiven and we do not have the promise and the hope of eternal life. But Jesus did rise, we do have hope and joy, our sins are forgiven and we shall rise with HIM and our bodies shall be like HIS. Like in our Gospel today, we may not recognise our bodies, just as the two disciples didn't recognise Jesus. We may not even recognise Jesus as HE walks beside us, but have faith, He is walking with us and we recognise HIM in the breaking of the bread.
