

# CATECHETICAL CORNER - "BÍ ULLAIMH"

Those of us who were or are members of the guides or scouts, will recognise the motto of the scouting movement - Bí Ullaimh/Be Prepared. Some of us spend a lot of time preparing for things; getting ready if we are going out, getting organised if we are going on holiday, perhaps getting the veg prepared early if we are having a large number for dinner. Some are more prepared than others and write lists etc..., while others are more '*fly by the seat of your pants*' in their preparation style. Some people are very house-proud and much of the preparation may be in cleaning the house or decorating if a visitor is coming, especially if it is an important visitor.

Since the time of their Baptism, but most especially since last September/October the boys and girls of second class have been working towards their First Holy Communion. Many of them have participated in all of the monthly preparation masses. They have done some work at home and in school which has been brought to the church. They have also been working really hard in school learning the mass responses and prayers of the Mass. Holy Communion for the first time is a significant moment in the life of all Catholics. So too are our second, third, and all subsequent Communions. Do we and should we prepare for our 951st communion, or whatever number it happens to be? And if so, how? Or do we just turn up, almost taking the Eucharist for granted?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) makes it clear to us that preparation is essential. In paragraph 1384 it says this: "The Lord addresses an invitation to us, urging us to receive him in the sacrament of the Eucharist..." In #1385 the CCC sets out how we should respond to this invitation from the LORD: "To respond to this invitation we must prepare ourselves for so great and so holy a moment. St. Paul urges us to examine our conscience: "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For any one who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself." (1 Cor.11:27-28). The same paragraph goes on: "Anyone conscious of a grave sin must receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before coming to communion."

In addition the CCC points out, "To prepare for worthy reception of this sacrament, the faithful should observe the fast required in their Church." (#1387) We used to have to abstain from food from midnight before receiving Holy Communion, now this is what the Church says: "A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink <u>except for only water</u> <u>and medicine</u>." (CIC Can 919). In addition we should try to be reconciled with those we have hurt or sinned against as well as forgiving those who have hurt or sinned against us. "So then, if you are bringing your offering to the altar and there remember that your brother [sister] has something against you, leave your offering there before the altar, go and be reconciled with your brother [sister] first, and then come back and present your offering." (Mt.5:23-24)

Our preparation for the coming of Jesus to us in Holy Communion, isn't to make us worthy, because, as we say at every mass, quoting from the Gospel of St Matthew; "Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof..." (Mt.8:8). Our preparation is so that we might gain the benefit of our Communion, that there is nothing that should inhibit this. "The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus." (CCC #1391)

Just as we prepare our homes for a visitor, so we are to prepare our hearts to receive Jesus. I suppose we should strive to be 'Heart-proud' just as we would be 'house-proud'.
