CATECHETICAL CORNER - ADVENT...TIMES 3

We have probably all heard many times that the word 'Advent' means coming or arrival. And we are probably also aware that the Advent Season, it is not Christmas yet, is a time of preparing for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. But we might not be aware that when we talk of Advent, and the coming of Christ, we are, in fact, referring to three comings of Christ.

The first Advent of Christ is His birth which we celebrate in at Christmas time. Christmas time is the liturgical season that runs from Christmas Day up to the feast of the Epiphany on January 6th. This great event, the Incarnation is also remembered each day when we pray the Angelus. Traditionally the Angelus is prayed three days each day at 6am, noon and 6pm and it recalls the Annunciations to Mary and the Birth of our Lord.

The second Advent of Christ, is what we call the Second Coming at the end of time, this is called the 'Escathon', the Greek word meaning the end. We look forward to, and indeed our whole life should be one long Advent Season, preparing for the coming of Christ. The end of all things, the Escathon, is properly understood, not as the case of Christ returning to a world from which he departed when He ascended to Heaven. Rather, it is the case of Christ becoming visible to a world in which He has been present but unseen since the Ascension. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), put's it like this:

"When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Saviour's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming..." (CCC # 524)

The third Advent of Christ is the coming of Christ in the Sacramental and ordinary life of the Church and of the individual Christian. In many ways this is the Advent of Christ over which we have some control. At Baptism we receive all that is needed to live the life of Grace, to live a life untied to Christ. Grace is a free gift and as such we are free to respond to that gift or not. The grace, the gift, remains in us, but it can be that it is like an un-opened and un-used gift.

The liturgical season of Advent is a time for us to relook at the grace we have been given, it is an opportunity to focus on the coming of Christ, not just in His incarnation or at the end times, but in the ordinary every day and most especially in our sacramental life.

We have two weeks, give or take, before we celebrate the Incarnation, how can we use this time wisely to be like John the Baptist and prepare a way for the Lord?

Saint of the Week - Saint John of the Cross

O Blessed Jesus, give me stillness of soul in You. Let Your mighty calmness reign in me. Rule me, O King of Gentleness, King of Peace. Amen.
